Background: On February 25, 2021, in *State v. Blake* 197 Wn.2d 170, 481 P.3d 521 (2021)), the Washington State Supreme Court ruled that Washington’s simple drug possession law was unconstitutional and void. Consequently, thousands of simple drug possession convictions need to be vacated, including convictions of currently incarcerated people. Public defenders across the state are working to deliver Blake relief to individuals under DOC control and/or individuals who have already served their sentences. Over one year post-*Blake*, a need remains in some counties for defense counsel to provide Blake relief to people serving DOC sentences, as well as for people who are no longer serving a sentence but need to obtain a vacation of their conviction.

Position Summary: OPD will enter into a contract or contracts with solo practice attorneys and/or multi-attorney organizations who will provide legal services to indigent clients potentially eligible for *Blake* relief. Such services will include: coordination and communication with criminal justice stakeholders in Okanogan County; regularly reviewing DOC data provided by OPD to prioritize relief for incarcerated individuals; and client representation on resentencings and vacations.

Contractors will be expected to serve a minimum number of clients each month. Contractors will generally be expected to file four motions per month for vacation/resentencing on behalf of clients under DOC supervision, and eight motions per month for vacation for clients who are no longer under DOC supervision. However, these expectations may be adjusted to account for contractor capacity and depending on local factors. OPD is seeking to fill position(s) in Okanogan County.

This RFQ is open to solo practice attorneys or multi-attorney offices.

Compensation: Each contract will be compensated \$90.00 hourly, with a contract cap as applicable. The number of hours per week or month that will be available under the contract will vary depending on local circumstances.

Required Qualifications: OPD is seeking attorneys with the following qualifications:

- Licensed member in good standing with the Washington State Bar;
- Carries malpractice insurance;
- Is Class C felony-qualified under the WA Supreme Court Standards for Indigent Defense;
- Knowledge of Washington State criminal law;
- Experience with sentencing and offender scoring under the Washington's Sentencing Reform Act.

Desired Qualifications: In addition, the following qualifications are preferred:

- Experience working with incarcerated people;
- Experience practicing law as a public defense attorney;
- Experience litigating CrR 7.8 motions; and
- Experience working with marginalized communities.
